Easter Dinner in NYC: David Burke Kitchen



David Burke Kitchen (opened in 2011 and overseen by Executive Chef Raoul Whitaker) boasts an interior inspired by its SoHo surroundings, blending cool industrial simplicity with the rustic warmth of a country barn. At the entrance, a staircase leads up to the glass-enclosed Treehouse Bar, where guests can enjoy private dinners with handcrafted cocktails and sweet and savory snacks like chicken dumplings or Maine lobster toast. Downstairs, the 130-seat, loft-like main space is divided into a bar and dining room with denim banquettes and a barn roof. The open kitchen and glass-enclosed wine cave allow guests a peek behind the scenes, while Chef Whitaker's theatrical style is reflected in the carving station, where a variety of meats are carved and whole-roasted fish, lobster, and casseroles are plated in the center of the dining room. *23 Grand St., 212-201-9119, davidburkekitchen.com*
